"**Everyday**" is a song written by [Buddy Holly](#) and [Norman Petty](#), recorded by [Buddy Holly and the Crickets](#) on May 29, 1957 and released on September 20, 1957 as the B-side to "[Peggy Sue](#)". On the original single the Crickets are not mentioned, but it is known that Holly plays [acoustic guitar](#); drummer [Jerry Allison](#) slaps his hands on his lap for percussion; [Joe B. Mauldin](#) plays a stand-up [acoustic bass](#); and producer [Norman Petty](#)'s wife, Vi, plays the [celesta](#) (a keyboard instrument with a [glockenspiel](#)-like tone, used in such classical pieces as "Dance of the Sugarplum Fairy" from [The Nutcracker](#)).
