2	Come fly with me 033	A popular song performed by Frank Sinatra, composed by Jimmy Van Heusen and Sammy Cahn in 1957.
3	Let a smile be your umbrella 138	A cheery song from 1927 that reminds us to keep our chin up, even in hard times. Written by Irving Kahal, Drancis Wheeler and Sammy Fain.
4	Rhythm of life 039	A Broadway song from the show <i>Sweet Charity</i> , 1966.
5	The Rose 160	A classic pop song written by Amanda McBroom and made famous by Bette Midler, for which she won a Grammy in 1980 when it was used in the film of the same name.
6	Tonight 157	To Broadway again, with a classic Bernstein and Sondheim piece. West Side Story is the modern take on Romeo and Juliet, and the song <i>Tonight</i> is the song of anticipation and excitement before the teenagers meet.

8	Feature item – Ching Wong and John Hart	<i>Beautiful Dreamer</i>
9	The Candy Man 143	Staying with popular musicals, <i>The Candy Man</i> is taken from the evergreen favourite film, <i>Wonka & The Chocolate Factory</i> .
10	Yesterday 041	Turning to the 1960s, the Beatles took the musical world by storm. This next piece is a sad song of broken hearts and regret. <i>Yesterday</i> tells the story of one person's sadness and confusion.
11	Hallelujah 046	To introduce the next song, all you need are two words: Leonard, Cohen. Popular with audiences of all ages and introduced to children when it was included in the animated film, <i>Shrek</i> , please enjoy our rendition of Hallelujah.
12	Both sides now 086	Canadian-born Joni Mitchell made a name for herself in the 1960s and her career has spanned decades. <i>All Music</i> has stated, "When the dust settles, Joni Mitchell may stand as the most important and influential female recording artist of the late 20th century".
13	Danny Boy 059	This next tune is to Ireland, what Waltzing Matilda is to Australia. Written in 1910, <i>Danny Boy</i> is a heartbreaking ballad of parting set to a traditional melody.
14	Feature piece – John Hart, Fred Pitcher, Tim Rothberg, John Hardiman, Trevor Boundy	<i>Swansea Song OR Sweet Violets</i>
15	Feature piece – Libby with guitar.	<i>Different Drum was written by Mike Nesmith in 1965 and made hugely famous by a band called Stone Poneys featuring Linda Rondstadt on vocals.</i>
1	Putting on the Ritz 125	It's hard to not feel excited when you hear this next song.

6		Written by Irving Berlin, nothing says 1920s dapper quite like <i>Putting On The Ritz</i> .
1 7	Personality 158	To the 1950s now and this song is one of trying to win the heart of someone who is just a little out of reach. Personality is a cheeky song performed by many artists, including Lloyd Price and Jerry Lee Lewis.
1 8	It's a sin to tell a lie 104 STRAIGHT ON INTO item 19 – don't sit down 😊	A 1930s song was a great hit for many dance bands and has had many revivals over the decades, and defining it as a classic. Keep your ear and eye on our musicians as we play It's A Sin To Tell A Lie.
1 9	A world of our own 070	To Australian pop stars now with The Seekers. A World Of Our Own was a 1965 international hit for the group, reaching #19 on the US Billboard Hot 100, and #2 on the US Billboard Easy Listening chart.
2 0	A Wonderful Day Like Today -134	So many songs from musical theatre can stand all on their own and our next song is no different. <i>A Wonderful Day Like Today</i> was written for the 1964 show <i>The Roar of the Greasepaint – The Smell of the Crowd</i> . Other hits from the show include The Joker (used on the opening credits of TV comedy series Kath and Kim, and Feeling Good recorded by music megastars Nina Simone, Michael Buble, and George Michael.
